■ Södertörn University Open4Research Research Funding Database

Södertörn University is now subscribed for the Open4Research service!
 Open4Research is an online database that is continuously updated and contains announcements of research funds and funding opportunities from thousands of funders around the world. It is also possible to automatically monitor announcements of interest. Since October 1, 2021, Södertörn University has a subscription with Open4Research. All employees of the University have access to the database.

One of the best features of this database is the Search filtering functions: by status (early, mid-career, senior career, etc.); by funding source and type, then sort results by deadline, funding type or research discipline. The database is updated and verified on a daily basis. If you would like to get a broader picture of the funding landscape with relevance for your research, you can use the Browse function to zoom in on funding areas.

With the help of the database, you can more easily compare funding options outside Sweden or even outside Europe, and build a funding strategy with your consortium-partners. There are also featured articles and specific Guides available in the Reference Library under the Help & Advice section (in the top bar). Insights and tips are discussed in features regarding European and international funding. One of the Guides provides an excellent oversight to the 300 separate European funding programs, of which Horizon Europe is only one! You can learn about funding opportunities for R&D and educational collaborations under the other community action programs, as well as the structural funds.

All proposals that are above 5 M SEK/yr, or require a written commitment (support letter, commitment of the host institution, etc.) has to be processed by the central research support administration. All proposals applying for EU-funding require internal co-funding for the university's operational overhead, therefore need to be pre-approved by the vice-chancellor, so please contact the central research support administration (Brigitta or Gabriela) for more information and admin support!</p>
